

Making Ice Cream



The main ingredient in dairy ice cream is milk. This milk comes from cows. Milking machines collect the milk from the cows. The machines pump the milk into a tank. The tank keeps the milk cool until it can be collected from the farm.

A large truck collects the milk from the farm. This refrigerated truck is called a tanker. The tanker keeps the milk cool on the way to the factory.



This



At the factory, milk is mixed with sugar to make an ice cream mixture. The mixture is quickly heated and cooled to kill any germs that are in the milk.

Then the mixture is stirred to get rid of lumps. Flavours and colours are added. The ice cream is then put into the freezer to harden.



Safety in the Kitchen

Kitchens can be dangerous places, especially when someone is getting food ready. Remember these tips to keep you safe in the kitchen.

- When a meal is being prepared, try to keep your pets out of the kitchen. It is easy to trip over them and someone could get hurt.
- Always walk sensibly in the kitchen.
- If you are going to help prepare food, make sure you wash your hands.
- Before you start making things in the kitchen, wait for a grown-up to come and help you.
- Never take electrical equipment, such as tablets and mobile phones, near water in the kitchen.
- Ask a grown-up to help you reach things in cupboards.
- Never touch hot objects or surfaces.
- Never touch knives or other sharp objects you may see in the kitchen.



STOP - DROP - ROLL


If your clothes catch fire remember...

All About Beaches

What Is a Beach?

Beaches are always found next to a stretch of water, such as the sea or a lake. Usually, they are composed of rock which could be in the form of sand, pebbles, gravel or shingle.

At some beaches, there is a high and low tide. This means that at certain points of the day, the sea comes further up the beach. On some beaches, at times, the sea completely covers it.

Beach Activities

Beaches are a popular choice for both a holiday or a day trip. As you can spend a full day there, many people choose to take a picnic. Other activities include building sandcastles of all shapes and sizes as well as playing a variety of ball games. People also choose to paddle at the seashore although it can be rather chilly. People have enjoyed coming to the beach for many years. Amazingly, over 200 can be found along our coastline. There are also other man-made beaches, which can be found next to lakes.


Blackpool Beach increased in popularity when the railway was invented.
